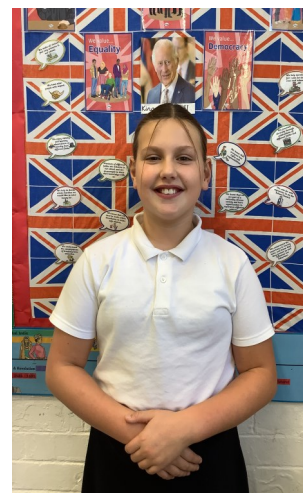

Magical Maths!

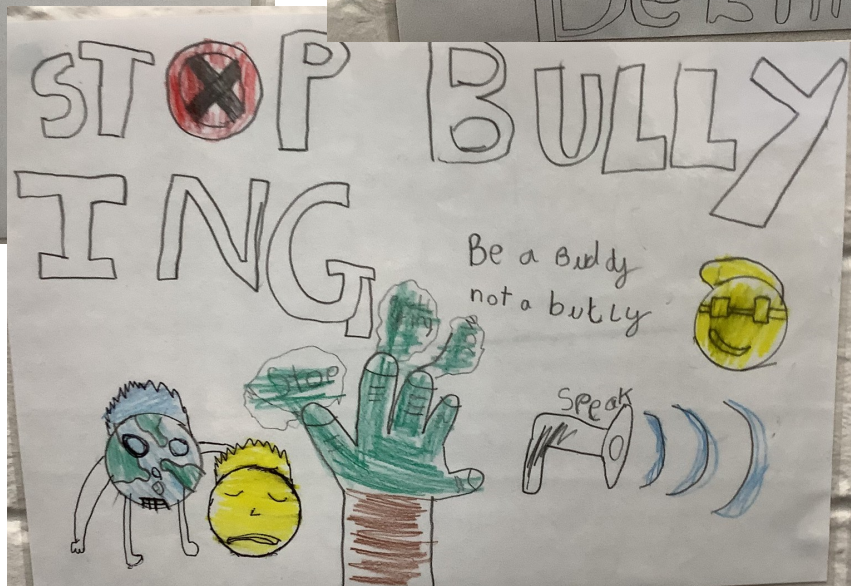
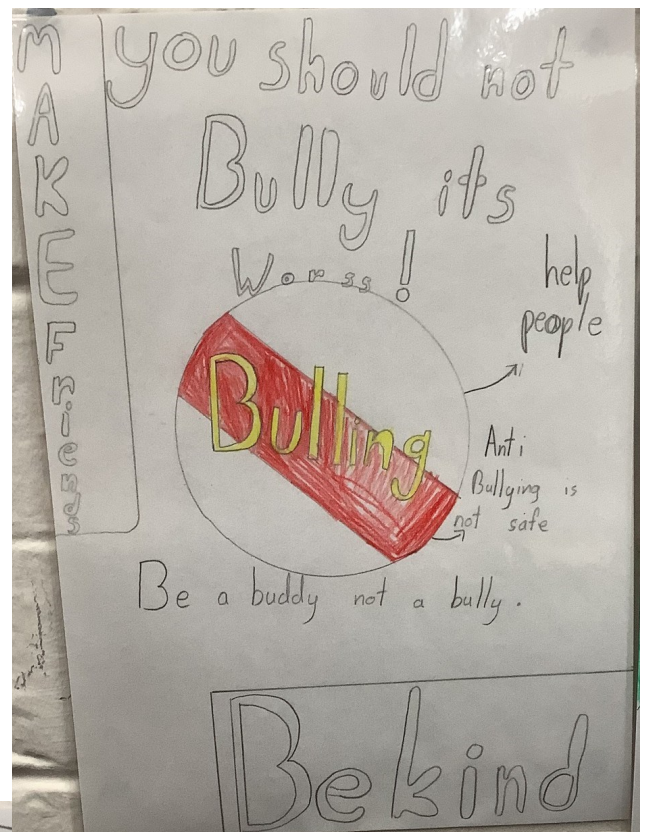
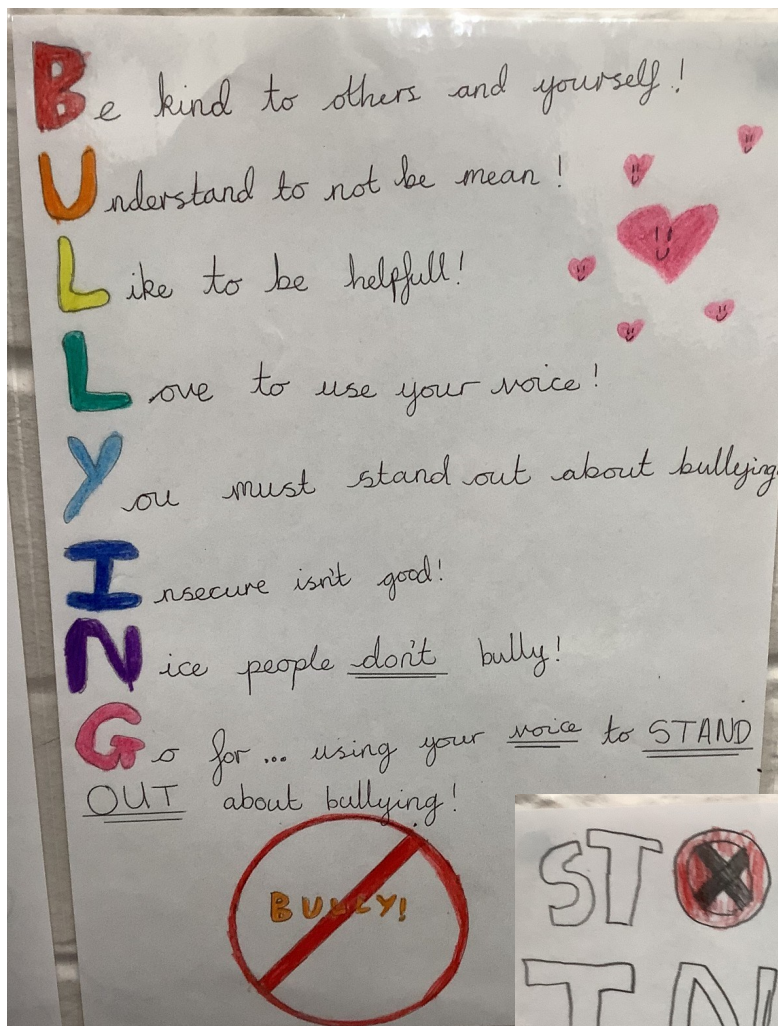

Anti-bullying week is a really important time. This is because it teaches children the importance of being kind and how people feel if they are being bullied.

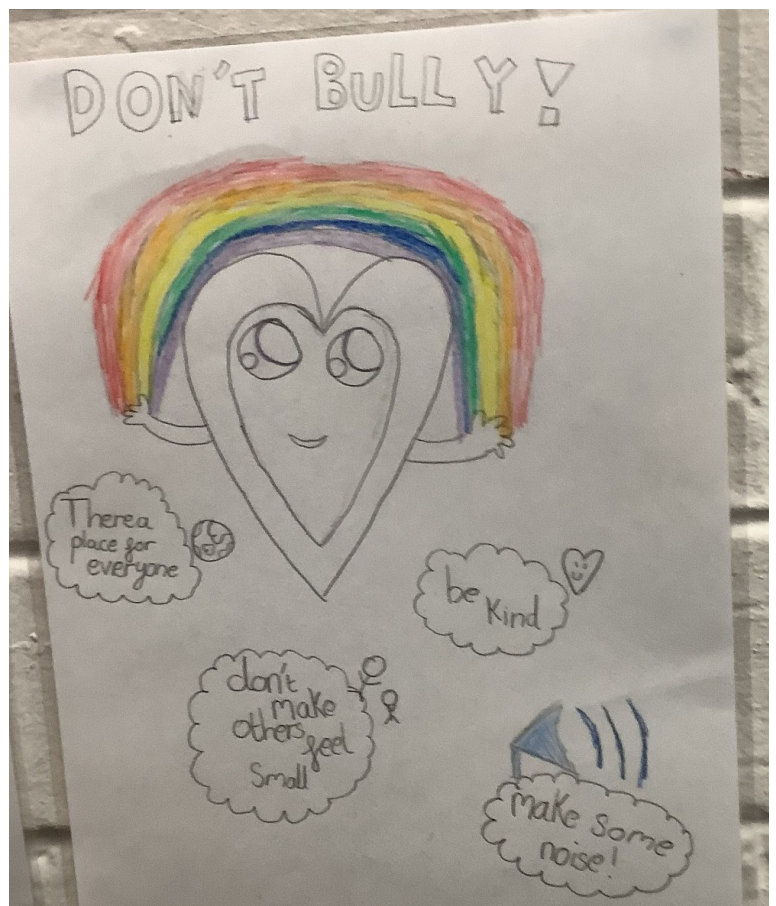
But what should you do if you witness bullying? Always tell a **trusted** adult! This could be a teacher, aunty, uncle, older sibling or parents. It doesn't even have to be your class teacher! YOU CAN TELL ANY TRUSTED ADULT. Here are some posters with important messages about bullying that some pupils created in PSHE.

1. A young boy is getting approached by boys that are older than him and the mean boys are circling him. The boy is very scared, what should you do?
2. A young girl is at the park. She gets approached by older children who start to say racist things to her. She does not know what to do, her friend starts to laugh and be rude as well. What should you do?

A Y3 girl walks over and kicks it down. Then he wants to speak but can't as he speaks a different language. The girl makes fun of him persistently because of this. What would you do about this?

Road Safety

Our local PCSOs (Police Community Support Officers) came in to give a speech about road safety this term during an assembly. They talked to us about why it is important to be safe on the roads. They also helped us understand the best ways to be safe and protected.

These are the best ways to cross the road safely:

Cross while holding hands with an adult

Make sure to stay with an adult

Always look left, then right

Check for the green man to flash before you to go

You can go when there is a zebra crossing as long as you have looked for cars.



They also mentioned lollipop men or women who help us cross the road safely.

Did you know that PCSOs wear bright, reflective high-vis so that when a car or vehicle gets close they will see them in the dark? As well as that they also wear these so that they are noticeable. Who knew that our PCSOs are only there to help our communities.

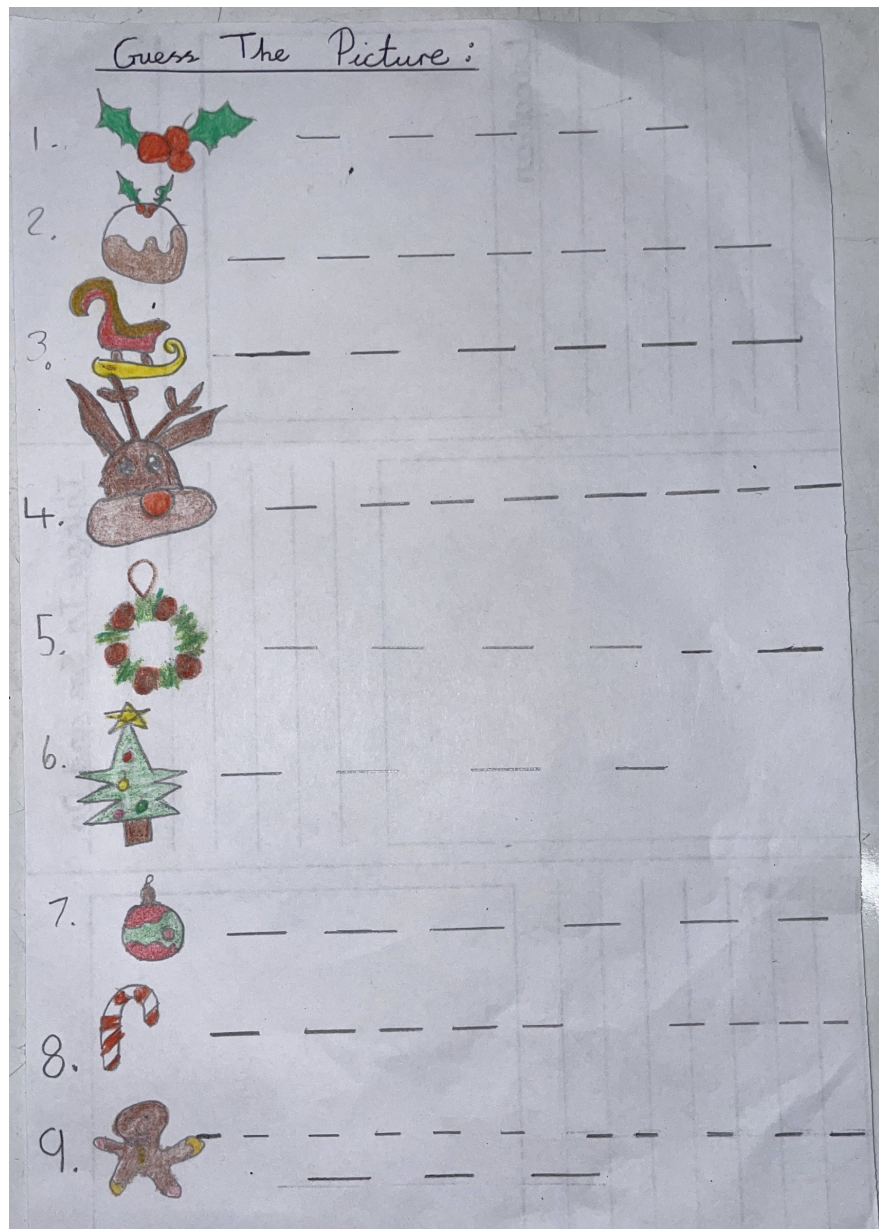

Career choices of children in Year 6

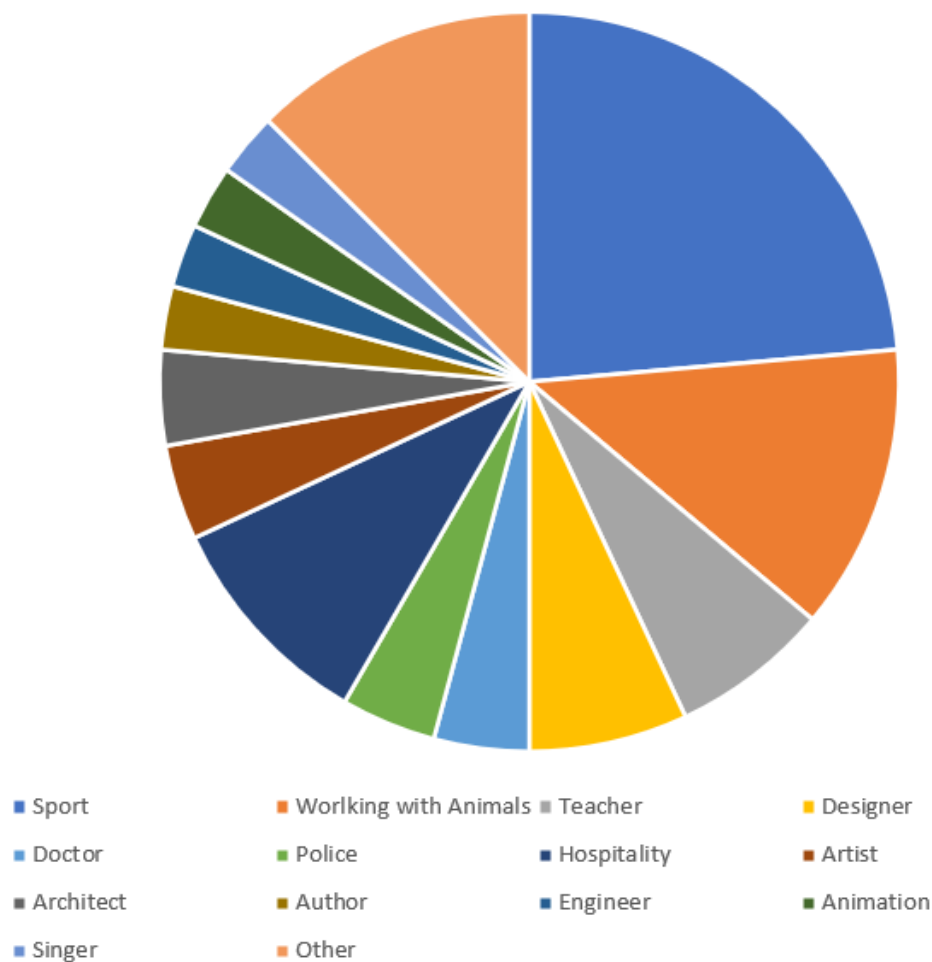
Every pupil in Year 6 was asked what job they would like when they are older and if there were any other jobs they would like to find out about.
